Week 1:

Explore the artist, Andy Warhol. Create a mood board with pictures, information and experiment in his style.

Week 2:

Explore the artist Amedeo Modigliani. Create a mood board with pictures, information, and experiment in his style.



This week will be focusing on our pencil techniques. Use the worksheets to help you practise your skills. If you're feeling confident create a self portrait using your new pencil skills.




Hatching- Lines in one direction darker when lines are closer together the tip of your pencil. Values appear Shade the next 2 rows with lines using Blending-Shade the shapes on the right with the side of your pencil blending from your lightest value to darkest 0 Value Scale- shade each box matching the value above. 


Week 3:

Explore the artist, Suzanne Valadon. Create a mood board with pictures, information, and experiment in his style.


